
Parents Supporting Parents

It has been a busy summer, not to mention getting hot quickly, but now, it is ending. That in and of itself can be bittersweet. Looking back on lazy days in the pool or pond, cook-outs, or finding cover in the pouring rain, new memories are captured for us to look on fondly as we get back into the swing of autumn work and school activities. For parents, that might mean not worrying about whether their children are occupied as they continue their work through the summer. The children might be excited about seeing school friends again but not much about studying new subjects. However you feel about this next season, I hope that you will be able to see the potential for joy in both memories of the past and anticipation of your future.

Over the last few months, some of our plans for gathering and fun panned out, and some did not. The weather certainly had an effect, but on the whole, we achieved the desired effect of remaining connected even while many of us took our vacations. With the passing of some of our dearest friends, we came together to comfort and console each other. At the same time, we welcomed many of our neighbors into the church building as several groups were looking for a safe and comfortable space to meet. This September, we are welcoming Back to Church all those we have missed over the summer and over the years and reminding our neighbors of our love. In other words, we all need to learn how to love each other better, and we have the most impact by expressing that love together in ways that truly matter. After this study, in November and December, we want to invite anyone and everyone to our Saving Grace Financial Wellness series. One way we show the true nature of our discipleship is through the use of money. Happy Birthday Marge! By Joyce Lee



On Sunday, August 4th, our member and friend Marge Quallis celebrated her 100th birthday at a (Surprise, to her!) Open House at her home at 1 Harvey Avenue in Yardley. Church members were the first to arrive, with Pastor Lee arriving

after the Zoom worship service, bringing a GIANT birthday card, signed by members of the congregation and GIANT "Happy 100th Birthday!" gold and silver letters and balloons, which he posted on Marge's front lawn, so that everyone who passed by would know that their neighbor, Marge, with friends and family was celebrating her long and healthy life.

And, what a life it has been! Margaret Chaty Quallis, daughter of Hungarian immigrants, was born in Trenton on August 6, 1924, and moved to Yardley in 1950 after her husband Gerard, his brother John, and their father built their house on Harvey Avenue. Daughter, Vada was born the same year, followed by 2nd daughter, Lynne in 1952. Marge and Gerry began attending YUMC (then YMC), becoming active almost immediately. Marge, a Trenton Public School teacher (2nd and 3rd Grades), also taught 1st and 2nd Sunday School at YMC/YUMC for about 25 years. In the 1960s and 1970s, she was active in YUM's outreach ministry in the Yardley community, and most recently served as a member of YUMC's TASK (Trenton Area Soup Kitchen) Volunteer Team as well as being a faithful volunteer in the church office every week.

Now, at 100 years young, Marge remains mostly at home, aided by "Seniors Helping Seniors" caregivers Karen and Judy, her daughters, Vada in Yardley and Lynne in Dauberville (near Kutztown, PA), friends from church, extended family members, and neighbors.

Marge is warm and welcoming, concerned and compassionate, generous, humorous, with a wealth of experience in living and loving others. She has a good memory of her years and activity at YMC/YUMC. And, she would love to share time and conversation with you.

My thanks to you, my congregation, for sending me the giant birthday card with all of your signatures on it. And, thanks to Pastor Lee for bringing the card to me at my Open House on August 4th, along with the giant birthday letters and balloons that you put up on my lawn to tell everyone that I was now 100 years old! All of this touched my heart so very much. I enjoyed my special birthday, the many cards that I received, and the visitors who came to see me that day.


We have an amazing staff and YUMC wouldn't be doing what it does today in mission without the support and work of our wonderful staff. THANK YOU!

We are back! Wednesdays are coming back! We can't wait to see you Wednesday September 18th for kick off night! Pizza


